

## **Scam Jam Helps Residents Protect Themselves from Fraud**

oo often, constituents call my office to report that they've been the victim of a scam or identity theft. In June, I partnered with the state Department of Banking and Securities and state Representative Tina Davis to raise awareness about common scams and provide resources and information to help our constituents protect their finances. Nearly 100 individuals gathered at the Bristol Township Senior Center on June 7th to hear from experts about common scams, when to report scams and fraud to the police, how and when to freeze a credit report and how to bank safely online. It was great to see so many



folks interested in this workshop. I will be hosting two additional Scam Jam workshops this fall, on September 29th at Falls Township Senior Center and on November

## **Recovering from July's Tragic Flash Flood**

n July 15th our community experienced the tragic loss of seven lives when eleven vehicles were trapped in a flash flood on Washington Crossing Road (Route 532) in Upper Makefield Township. The day after the storm, U.S. Senator Bob Casey, U.S. Senator John Fetterman, Governor Josh Shapiro, Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency Director Randy Padfield, PennDOT Secretary Mike Carroll, Bucks County Commissioners Bob Harvie and Diane Marseglia, and state Rep. Perry Warren all visited the affected area and pledged their support to the recovery and rebuilding effort.

Four sections of state roadways in Upper Makefield and Lower Makefield townships were severely damaged and PennDOT began work immediately to stabilize the roads and repair the damage. All of the roads reopened ahead of schedule thanks to the incredible job of PennDOT engineers and the work crews.

The Maplevale neighborhood in Lower Makefield Township was also impacted by the storm, with a large sinkhole and burst pipe extending from two backyards to the Delaware Canal towpath. I've made several visits to the neighborhood and my office and I have worked with the Township, the PA Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (which oversees the canal), the PA Department of Environmental Protection and Rep. Warren's office to expedite the repair work and protect the homes that have been most severely impacted.
